





PLANNING FOR TRANSITIONS – WE DO NOT THINK THESE WILL BE SIGNIFICANT FOR OUR PUPILS. WE WILL

- Maintain quality education for all pupils
- Identify opportunities for improvement
- Build on existing strengths and relationships
- Involve parents to identify key priorities and concerns
- Recognise the challenges in moving to coeducation
- Work together to minimise disruption
- Work together to maximise communication



KEY FACTORS SHAPING THE NEED FOR CHANGE

- Significant reduction in Applications
- Significant reduction in Income 30% drop
- Parental choice has changed move away from single sex education
- Our model has eroded the separation over the years 20% of ALL KS4 lessons are taught in mixed classes
- The reduction in numbers in the Boys school would ultimately make it close. We seek to prevent that happening.
- Build a school for the future whilst recognising and cherishing its past.

WHO MAKES THE DECISIONS?

- After the consultation a report will be written for the Governing Body, Diocese and Local Authority to consider.
- The points made by parents, children and any other stakeholders, will be collected together and responded to.
- The Local Authority will decide whether to publish a statutory notice in December 2022. The consultation responses and the views of the governing bodies and Diocese will inform the decision.

WHAT HAPPENS NEXT?

When	What
Autumn Term 2022	School level consultation
November 2022	Governors/LA/Diocese confirm whether to move to Statutory Notice
December/January	Formal Statutory Notice Consultation
February 2023	Council Cabinet decide whether to progress
March 2023	Governors develop implementation plan
September 2023	Schools become a single school with sixth form

Throughout this period governors and school leaders work closely with parents and other stakeholders to identify any aspect of the planned changes that has not been fully considered, or could have a negative impact for the young people. Through strong communication transition will be reflective, effective and stresses minimized.
